

The following are changes reflected in the omnibus amendment for Substitute House Bill 26:

- Removes the application of the motor fuel tax to compressed natural gas (CNG).
- Retains current law as it relates to credits to the motor fuel tax for losses due to shrinkage and evaporation and for prompt payment.
- Increases the earmark for Transportation Improvement Districts currently in the bill to \$4.5 million per year from \$3.5 million.
- Makes the failure to display a front license plate a secondary offense if the car is legally parked.
- Creates a 2-year pilot program that reduces commercial vehicle registrations from \$30 to \$15 in Clinton, Lucas, Montgomery and Stark counties.
- Requires the Registrar of Motor Vehicles to study the effect of lowering commercial trailer fees to make Ohio more competitive with other states.
- Establishes a Division of Freight within the Department of Transportation (ODOT).
- Restores current law in relation to the percentages of the motor fuel tax required to be used by local governments to supplement their transportation spending.
- Directs the Registrar of Motor Vehicles to adopt rules allowing non-profit corporations acting as deputy registrars to advertise that some of their proceeds go to charity.
- Allows non-government deputy registrars to operate vending machines.
- Permits a third party business operating in the same building as a non-government deputy registrar to advertise in the deputy registrar's office.
- Revises the definition of urban areas in relation to the language in the bill regarding entrance and exit ramps to adjacent municipalities in differing counties with populations over 30,000 with one of the municipalities being in a county with a population over 1 million.
- Deletes "and to propose alternatives, including an Eastern Bypass solution" from the study of the Eastern Bypass of Greater Cincinnati required by the substitute bill.
- Mandates that a school district that receives revenues from a license plate to file an annual report. Prohibits commercial vehicles from purchasing a St. Ignatius, Brecksville-Broadview Heights or Chagrin Falls license plate.
- Names the eastbound and westbound lanes of interstate route number 90, in Cuyahoga county only, to be known as "Officer David Fahey Memorial Highway."
- Designates a portion of state route 43 in Jefferson county as the "Army Corporal Carl H. Bernhart Memorial Highway."
- Directs that all signs that indicate National Park System areas and that are erected on state highways to display the arrowhead symbol of the National Park Service.
- Titles a portion of state route 2 in Lake county as the "Lcpl Bret M. Poklar Memorial Highway."
