## HB 2 (Enacted) CREDENTIAL PROGRAMS (Cross, J., Lepore-Hagan, M.)

To create the TechCred Program and the Individual Microcredential Assistance Program and to develop a grant program to support industry sector partnerships.

## HB 6 (Enacted) ENERGY (Callender, J., Wilkin, S.)

To facilitate and continue the development, production, and use of electricity from nuclear, coal, and renewable energy resources in this state, to modify the existing mandates for renewable energy and energy efficiency savings, and to determine amounts of federal funding received for home weatherization services.

## HB 7 WATER FUND (Ghanbari, H., Patterson, J.)

To create the H2Ohio Trust Fund for the protection and preservation of Ohio's water quality, to create the H2Ohio Advisory Council to disburse money from the Fund for water quality programs, and to create the H2Ohio Endowment Board to make recommendations to the Treasurer of State regarding the issuance of securities to pay for costs related to the purposes of the Fund.
