

ACEC Ohio Transportation Committee Meeting Minutes 2:00 pm, Thursday February 13, 2020, ODOT Auditorium

#### 1. Call to order

### 2. ODOT Updates, Assistant Director Lloyd MacAdam, Deputy Director Dave Holstein, Office Administrator Mat Mauger (PPT Attached)

- Ohio's highway system has an estimated worth of \$115 billion
- ODOT needed \$0.15/gallon user fee, plus indexing, to maintain and build their infrastructure
  - o ODOT proposed \$0.18/gallon plus indexing, did not get all of what was asked for
- User fee provides ODOT with \$450 million annually (55% of user fee)
- User fee provides locals with \$350 million annually (45% of user fee)
  - o 62.5% increase to cities
  - o 67% increase to townships
  - o 63.8% increase to counties (\$1.52 million annually to each county)
- What does this mean for ODOT?
  - o Before user fee FY2020 program would have been \$155 million in the red
  - o Before user fee FY2021 program would have been \$280 million in the red
  - User fee restored the program
    - \$50 million annually in safety projects
    - \$150 million annually in major new (TRAC)
    - 17% increase in miles of pavement replaced/resurfaced annually
    - 21% increase in number of bridges replaced/rehabilitated annually
    - 52% increase in number of safety projects administered annually
      - Therefore, there are 6 regional safety design contracts being released in February 2020
    - \$287 million in TRAC over the next 2 years, all construction
- Safety
  - 1,157 fatalities in 2019 and increasing each year due to distracted driving
    - 48% on local network, 52% on ODOT facilities
  - 2,778 fatalities in 1969. Safer cars, seat belt laws, education has led to decrease. See above, fatalities are now on the increase.
  - o 300,000 crashed per year, 94% due to driver error
  - Hands free law will, on average, reduce fatalities by 15.3%. See announcement on ODOT's homepage.
- Programmatics



- Will be fully populated 10 weeks prior to postings
  - Only exception is safety projects because funding may be sporadic
- Goal is to fully populate two programmatics out

#### ADA

- Many are non-compliant
- New guidance: every curb ramp will be compliant, or District Design Engineer will need to approve a waiver
  - With waiver, curb ramp should be designed as close to standards as possible
- Standards are going to build in construction tolerances, currently there are issues with construction
- New ADA web page on ORE's website
- Plan view dimensioning will be required
- New July 2020 release
- PDP modernization
  - Next 168 most dangerous locations will be addressed and delivered much faster
  - Need to start environmental and right-of-way much faster
    - Get project footprint faster
  - o Intersection Control Evaluation (ICE) will be implemented to speed Feasibility Studies
    - Identify best safety improvements (maybe top 3)
    - Identify best operational improvements (maybe top 3)
    - Marry these together to select preferred alternative
- Phase 1 paperless implementation
  - New pregualification for ITS, requires a course and test
  - New CFEG will post week of 2/17
  - Automated prequalification in late October of 2020
- Phase 2 paperless implementation
  - SAFe enhancements
    - All projects including task orders will be done in SAFe
  - Automation of agreements with electronic authorizations
  - Automation of online invoices
    - Will capture prompt payment of subconsultants (30 days from when paid by ODOT)

- 2020 Civil Rights Transportation Symposium

### • Developmental Goal Program

- In the near future, ODI and Consultant Services will be reconvening its Small Business Committee that was responsible for assisting ODOT with establishing the Developmental Goals for DBE and EDGE firms on certain consultant services contracts in the programmatics.
  - Now that there have been a few years since the program was implemented, ODI and Consultant Services plans to re-evaluate the effectiveness of the program
  - Ensure we are getting the results and outcomes that are positively impacting the DBE and EDGE firms, and developing them
  - Could end up in some changes and updates to the Developmental Goal Program

#### • Commercially Useful Function Monitoring

- ODOT District personnel will be conducting CUF evaluations for all DBE firms starting as
  of June 1, 2020 on Consultant Services projects (projects with DBEs toward goals and
  projects with DBEs not towards goals)
- This is a part of ODOT's Conciliation Agreement with FWHA, and must be fulfilled this year
- o CUF needs to be evaluated in order for DBEs to count toward the DBE Goal
- CUF Training was held for the Consultant Industry yesterday here at ODOT to provide information on what to expect
- The CUF Training yesterday was recorded so you can view it that way, if you happened to miss the in-person training

#### Prompt Payment Monitoring

- ODOT must monitor that <u>ALL</u> subconsultants are paid within 30 days of ODOT paying the prime consultant
- This is a part of ODOT's Conciliation Agreement with FWHA, and must be fulfilled this year
- Consultant Services and ODOT's IT Division are working on a solution for how the prime consultant will report payments to <u>ALL</u> subconsultants
- More information will be shared on this requirement and expectations from the consultant industry in the near future
